2010 Featured Artist - Betty Ann Packler

Betty Ann Packler was born in North Carolina and moved to the Miami, Florida area after completing her Bachelor of Fine Arts at UNC-Greensboro. Working for Dade County for eight years, she then worked as a freelance graphic artist creating drawings of watch models for a major brand, children's fashion drawings for a local emerging clothing company, brochures, business cards, and note card designs.

She has worked with known local artists in classes and workshops including, M. J. Wilson, David Chang, and Dottie Greene. While attending an arts institute at the University of Miami, she added clay and glass to her media. She has also worked with silk painting and design in silk. Lost wax jewelry design and calligraphy are other applications of her creativity.

Packler has donated pieces to local charity auctions, to Fairchild Tropical Garden, and churches in the area. Donated designs include drawings, landscape drawings, logo designs, and calligraphy certificates. Her painting of the grotto at Merrick House in Coral Gables was chosen by the Museum Coordinator to

be given in form of giclees as special awards and recognition and potential note cards.

She has been on the Dade Art Educators Board of Directors for two years and acted as co-chairman of the Miami Watercolor Show Committee for the 2005 Fall Show. She was awarded Signature Membership in the Miami Watercolor Society in the spring of 2005. While in Coral Gables she volunteered as a docent for the George Merrick House. She taught art for 20 years in Miami before retiring. She was selected her school's Teacher of the Year for 2006. She moved to Holly Springs, North Carolina in November 2006 and is now beginning to exhibit in the Raleigh area. Packler responds to the stimuli surrounding her and produces work reflecting the excitement and wonder that comes with the season changes. She is volunteering at the NC ART Museum and other venues to put back some of what has been given to her in the creation of a new life and the opportunity to be taken by her art to new levels. She has painted a watercolor of Yates Mill, which is displayed in the lobby where she volunteers.

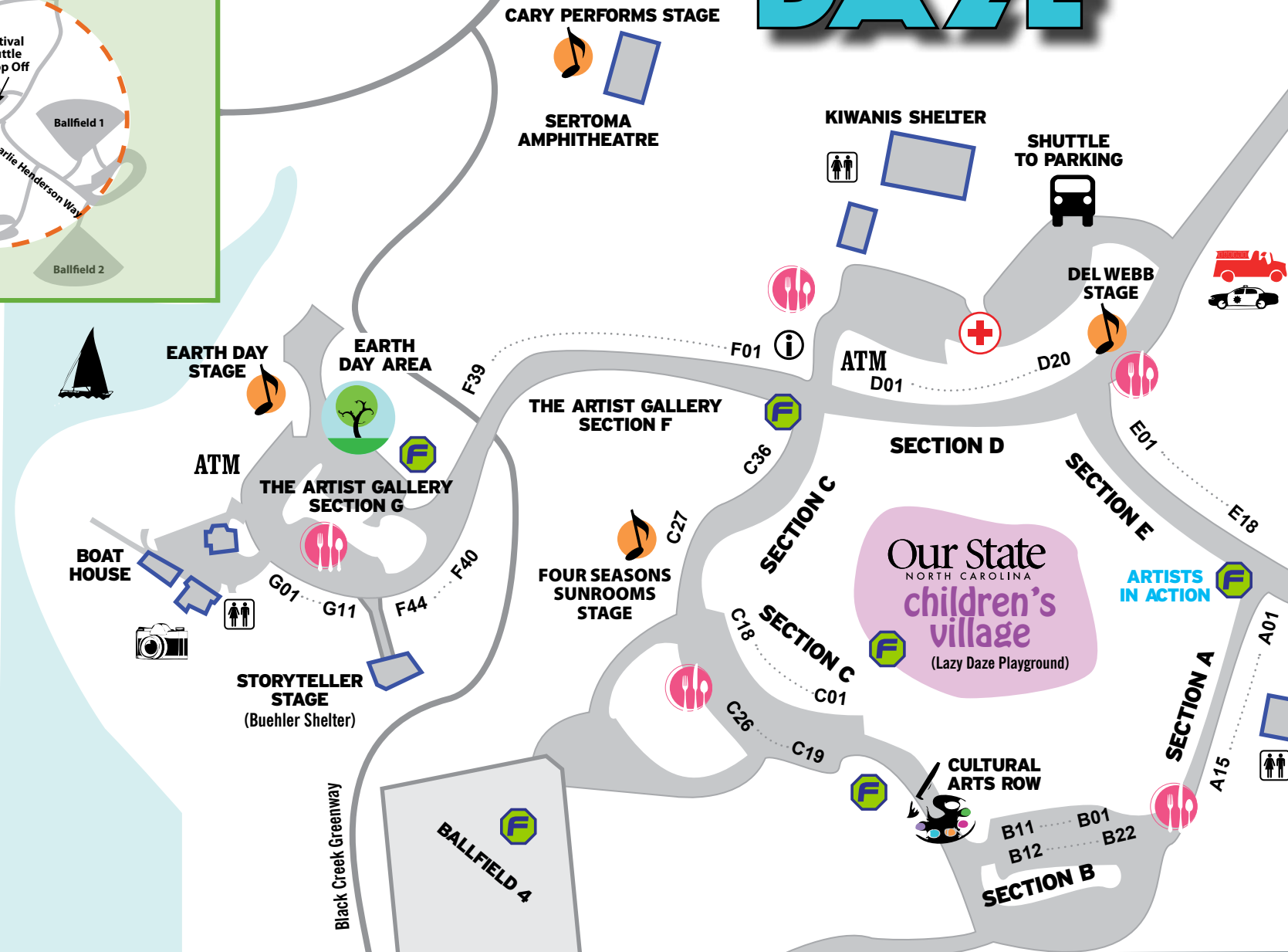

FESTIVALS HELP BUILD YOUR COMMUNITY!

The Spring Daze Arts & Crafts Festival and Lazy Daze Arts & Crafts Festival are administered through the Town of Cary's Parks, Recreation & Cultural Resources Department - which is dedicated to providing a variety of events that focus on community building.

Each year, proceeds from the festival are given back to the community in the form of grants benefiting projects that have a cultural arts focus, support the Town of Cary initiatives and support downtown Cary initiatives. During the past 33 years, more than \$475,000 has been returned to the Cary community through this program and more than 68 nonprofit organizations and projects have been impacted.

GETTING TO THE FESTIVAL

FREE Festival Shuttle Bus – Easiest Way to Get to the Festival! - Park at the Town Hall Parking Deck located adjacent to the Cary Town Hall on Wilkinson Avenue (beside 101 Wilkinson Ave. Cary) and ride the free shuttle! Shuttles run every 15-20 minutes between 8:30a.m. and 5:30p.m.

Arrive by Car – Limited parking is available inside Bond Park at the Bond Park Community Center, Cary Senior Center or the Ropes Course parking area. A shuttle to the festival entrance is provided from the parking areas inside the Park.

Handicapped Accessible Parking – Arrive in Bond Park and use the provided handicapped parking. Look for the volunteers near the Cary Senior Center (Maury O'Dell Place) that will assist you in parking as close to the festival as possible in specially reserved handicapped parking. There is a handicapped accessible shuttle that travels inside the park to assist.

Use Cary's C-TRAN Fixed Route System for Free! – For Spring Daze, you can ride all C-Tran fixed routes FREE of charge to and from the festival! The route 4 C-TRAN bus will run every ½ hour leaving between 6am-9am and 3pm-7pm and hourly in between those times from the Train Station on Academy Street. From the west of Bond Park, you can also catch the inbound Route 4 from High House Crossing Shopping Center with stops along High House Road all the way to the Park. Use the Town of Cary Greenway System - Access the Festival by using either the Oxxford Hunt, Black Creek, or White Oak Creek Trails.
